



Camp is a good time to explore how God can be seen in the vastness of creation, the power of community, and even your own heart. We will discover how God's endless love launches amazing adventures and new mysteries to explore.

The scriptures for the 2018 summer camping season at Camp Mennoscah are below. Some camp weeks will not use all the scriptures. We invite you to read these with your camper(s) before coming to camp and to incorporate them into your daily worship.

Psalm 139—What If We Belong to God?

Nothing we can do can change God's intimate love for us.

Campers will learn that God already knows and loves them, be assured that God knows the hopes and fears they bring to camp, will get to know each other as children of God and experience welcome and hospitality.

Luke 1: 35-55—What If God is Bigger?

Celebrate the ways God's love can be made bigger.

Campers will explore the vastness of God's creation and learn that God is bigger than what has been and what we imagine will be. Wonder about what else they may still discover about God and discovery of God is a journey with no end.

Mark 2: 1-5—What If Hope Is Real?

Trusting and acting on behalf of hopeful instincts.

Campers will learn hope is a necessary force in our faith lives and is a sign of God's presence. How hope pushes us to innovate and create new solutions to the world's problems and by align our hope with God's hope we can seek to align them further.

John 6: 1-14—What If There is More than Enough?

We already have more than enough.

Campers will see that God provides us tools to be who we need to be and experience that the more we trust God's presence in our lives, the more we find ourselves guided toward abundance and peace. By combining our gifts and passions with God and others is all that is needed to accomplish our hopes.

Mark 7: 24-30—What If We Speak Up?

Fearlessness in the face of injustice.

Campers will discern God's way for the world and find the courage to use their gifts as God's voice and reflect on where the world needs them most.

Matthew 5: 13-16—What If We Change the World?

Embrace the ways that God wants to use us to make the world a better place.

Campers learn that responding to God's call can make a difference and that God's Spirit is alive in us. Imagine the world as God intends and find their community's support in changing the world.

Luke 10: 1-9—What If We Go Beyond?

You do not go alone.

Campers will believe in God's power to work through them and know they go into a world that is already bigger than it was before they came to camp. They will be encouraged to see beyond today and to proclaim God's vision for the future and invite others to participate.
